Separation from a child or a mother and family through adoption has lifelong consequences which have frequently been ignored or dismissed by professionals in the past. Despite official government apologies, there is still a lack of awareness and understanding in most services.

It is essential for workers in community services to be able to provide sensitive, trauma-informed support to individuals affected and make referrals to specialist services when required. This training provides an overview of the context, impacts, and how to provide appropriate care.
